However, I can connect from the client machine I'm exporting the files from using vpnadmin. A: Go to Windows Start->type network config on your search window and you will find the vpn config file under Device column. Just remove the passphrase from it. Once you removed it try connect through vpn. A: Depending on the version of PT installed on the workstation, they no longer support the reverse tunnel as a feature. Packet Tracer 6.1.9 and 6.2.0 are the last versions that support this functionality. The only way to do this would be to install an older version of PT on the client and then have the other users in the lab use that version. In my experience this functionality should be removed in later versions of the software (which means it won't even be supported anymore). I'm not familiar with the version that you're using.
